His native urbanity, his gentleness unassuming simplicity and never failing courtesy were always manifest in his intercourse with his fellow-members of the Bar. He was a good lawyer and an eminently careful and safe adviser. His nature was not a combative one, and therefore, he did not enjoy nor enter much into the clash and strife of trials in court, he delighted rather in quieter paths, in seeking and following out the principles of the law and the minutiae of practice.
