

RESOLUTION ON THE DEATH OF
EDWIN D. STRITE, JR.

WHEREAS, on May 9, 1987, Almighty God called from our midst our friend and fellow lawyer, Edwin D. Strite, Jr., and

WHEREAS Edwin, known to his friends and colleagues as "Eddie", or "Ed", was born on October 6, 1918, graduated from Chambersburg High School, in 1935, from Lafayette College, in 1939, and Dickinson School of Law in 1942, and served in combat with the United States Army, in the European Theater, during World War II; and

WHEREAS Eddie was admitted to practice before the Bar of the Court of Common Pleas for Franklin County, Pennsylvania, on December 5, 1942, and during his entire career practiced law in Franklin County, Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS Eddie was elected to and served in the Office of District Justice, in Chambersburg, Pennsylvania, for a period of twelve years, and also served for various periods of time, as Assistant District Attorney and as Assistant Public Defender for Franklin County, Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS Eddie is remembered by his colleagues, as a highly intelligent and thorough trial attorney when working on cases in litigation, and also as a very friendly and personable individual, and past member of the Pennsylvania and Franklin County Bar Associations; and

WHEREAS Eddie was involved in other community service, from time to time, was a past Exalted Ruler of the Elks Lodge, B.P.O.E. Lodge No. 0600, of Chambersburg, Pennsylvania, during the years 1951-52, and was a member of Central Presbyterian Church in Chambersburg, for many years and at the time of his death.

FURTHER, the Franklin County Bar Association, while accepting the inevitable, keenly feels the loss it has suffered and desires to preserve a record thereof

and thus bear testimony to the esteem in which he was held.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Franklin County Bar Association, in special meeting, assembled this 12th day of May, 1987, records an expression of its high regard for Edwin D. Strite, Jr., and for his service to his profession and his community and to express its deep sense of loss, as he will be sorely missed by his family, friends and associates.
